Pope Francis announces Year of Prayer

Pope Francis has announced the start of a Year of Prayer in preparation for the Catholic Church's 2025 Jubilee Year. The Pope said that 2024 will be 'a year dedicated to rediscovering the great value and absolute need for prayer in one's personal life, in the life of the Church, and in the world'. The Vatican's Dicastery for Evangelisation will publish resources to help Catholic communities to more fully participate in the Year of Prayer.

A jubilee is a special holy year of grace and pilgrimage in the Catholic Church, it typically takes place once every 25 years. The Vatican and the city of Rome are expecting an estimated 35 million people to flock to the Eternal City for the 2025 Jubilee Year of Hope – the first ordinary jubilee since the Great Jubilee of 2000. The 2025 Jubilee Year begins on 24 December (Christmas Eve) and concludes on 6 January 2026.

This term we will be focussing on the message of prayer from Pope Francis. We will be introducing family prayer boxes. More information will be shared with families later this term.

Child Safety Standards

Child safety standards in Victorian schools are designed to create a safe and secure learning environment for children. These standards encompass various aspects, including physical safety, emotional well-being, and protection against abuse and neglect.

Physical safety standards involve measures such as ensuring safe infrastructure, regular maintenance of buildings and equipment, and implementing emergency response plans. Schools are required to conduct regular safety drills, install appropriate safety features like fire alarms and extinguishers, and provide adequate supervision during activities.

Emotional well-being is another crucial aspect of child safety standards. Schools are expected to foster a positive and inclusive environment that promotes mental health and well-being. This includes implementing anti-bullying policies, providing counseling services, and promoting respectful and supportive relationships among students and staff.

Child protection standards are in place to prevent and respond to child abuse and neglect. Schools have a legal obligation to report any suspected cases of abuse and provide appropriate support to affected children. Staff members undergo mandatory training to recognize signs of abuse and understand their responsibilities in reporting and responding to such incidents.

Child safety standards in Victorian schools emphasise the importance of parental involvement and communication. Schools are required to establish clear communication channels with parents or guardians, ensuring they are informed about safety policies, procedures, and any incidents that may impact their child's well-being.

Last year in the school review it was acknowledged that our work in this space was exemplary, this year St Charles Borromeo will continue to provide a secure and nurturing environment where all students will flourish.


